UPCOMING SUMMER 2023 PROGRAMS

Campers will be living in cabins with other campers around their age along with counselors. Throughout the day, campers will have opportunities to do activities with their cabin groups as well as activities that they choose. There will also be a mix of less actives, such as arts and crafts and diabetes education games and sessions.

We are very happy to have our Adventure program active again this summer! This year, partnering with Blue Rise Adventures, campers coming to this 10-day program will travel through different areas of Massachusetts and New York and participate in special activities such as rafting, rock climbing, and backpacking. They will also learn more about caring for their diabetes individually as well as during higher intensity activities.

FUN AT RECENT COLOR WARS PROGRAM

Our recent Color Wars program was an exciting and unforgettable experience for all involved. Camp was buzzing with excitement and energy. Our campers were divided into three teams: red, green, and blue. Each team had a mix of campers with different ages and abilities, which made for a diverse and dynamic competition. Activities were designed to challenge campers' physical and mental abilities and to encourage teamwork. The teams competed in a variety of activities, such as gaga, dodgeball, and an arts & crafts challenge.

Some of the highlights of Color Wars were the banner-making task and the origin stories that the campers had to create. These tasks proved an opportunity to showcase their individual talents and skills implemented into a group product. We were blown away by the creativity and passion displayed by our campers, who sang, danced, told jokes, and performed skits to bring life to the origin stories of their color teams. It was clear that each camper had worked hard to prepare

for the crafts challenges, and the support and encouragement shown by their teammates was heartwarming.

A new addition to the list of Color War events this year was the egg-drop challenge which is a STEM activity that challenges participants to design and build a contraption that can protect an egg from breaking when dropped from a height. We witnessed teams constructing devices using materials such as



paper, straws, tape, and miscellaneous items such as pool noodles. We could not be happier to report that every single egg that was dropped survived the fall!

Throughout the program, the importance of sportsmanship was emphasized. We encouraged our campers to show respect and kindness towards their opponents, and to always give their best effort. It was heartening to see how the campers supported each other even when things did not go as planned. We were impressed by the way in which our campers showed grace and humility in both victory and defeat.

One of the things that made Color Wars so special was the way it brought our camp community together. The campers bonded with each other through shared experiences and challenges. We were also pleased to see how the program brought out the best in our staff members, who worked tirelessly to ensure that each camper had a positive and meaningful experience. As the program came to a close, we held a final event where the points were tallied, and the winning team was announced. In the end, the Blue Team emerged as the winners, but the real victory was the way in which each camper



had grown and developed through their participation in Color Wars.
